

# Vigil of Prayer for the Vigil of the Solemnity of the Annunciation Friday March 24th 2017

## Suggested Programme for the Day

You are welcome & invited to participate in all or part of this Pilgrimage Programme

### **12 Noon Holy Mass** - Chapel of Our Lady of Reconciliation RC National Shrine - Mass of Friday of 3rd Week of Lent

#### **Afternoon Programme - Led by Fr. Gwil Lloyd & Antonia Moffat**

2.15pm Meet at the Common Place in Walsingham Village outside the Museum and Walsingham Estate Office to enter Priory Grounds as a Group - - there is a £5 entry fee for adults and £2.50 for children 6-16yrs 2.30pm

Gather in the Priory Grounds of the ancient Priory of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. A time to be silent and to wander in the beauty of the Priory Grounds and to take stock of the destruction, desolation of ancient times represented by the ancient Priory Arch. Our ancestors knew the very same suffering of Iraq and Syria today... we are united with the persecuted Church of both past and present years.

2.45pm Gather under the Priory Arch for the reading of **The Lament for Walsingham** - ascribed to St. Philip Howard (1557-95), Earl of Arundel. Litany of Reparation re the destruction of the Shrine & Litany of Intercession for England.

2.55pm **Process together in silence to the spot of the Original Shrine of the Holy House of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary.**

3pm Invocation of the Holy Spirit & Reading of the Pynson Ballad 1465/1496 ascribed to Richard Pynson, printer to Henry VII which tells the story of the origins of Our Lady's Shrine in Walsingham. Meditation on **The Annunciation** of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Message of Our Lady of Walsingham and to pray the Joyful Mysteries of the Holy Rosary. Ending with Cardinal Griffin's Act of Consecration of England & Wales to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

3.30pm Silent walk of Reparation around the environs of the ancient Priory Grounds in penance & "In Expiation for the sin of our Division (amongst Christians) and for the Conversion of England." (Charlotte Boyd's intention) We will stop briefly at the grave of Alfred Hope Patten - founder of the Anglican Shrine - and remember his intention of Reparation - "In Reparation for the sins of sacrilege 400 years ago", he had embedded in the walls of the Holy House a stone from every monastic Monastery destroyed during the English Reformation).

3.40 pm Continue walk in silence and then stop at the place where the Priory Arch is in full view and pray the great Prayer of St. Michael the Archangel composed by Pope Leo XIII.

4pm Arrive at the Holy House in the Anglican Shrine
- Fr. Philip Barnes to welcome us
- 4.05pm Prayers for Unity in the Holy House and the Reading of John 17  
Prayers for the Release of the Holy Souls in Purgatory.
- 4.15pm-4.45 Tea Break in Anglican Shrine Cafe
- 4.45pm (sharp!) Continue walk in silence to Parish Church of the Annunciation

- 5pm-5.45pm Silent Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Intercession for Priests & simple Benediction
